

Fire Prevention Plan Program



INTRODUCTION

Over 150 major fires occur in workplace on an annual basis. Fire is the third leading cause of accidental death. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) estimates that most of these accidents can be prevented if proper safety precautions at jobsites are initiated. This course establishes uniform requirements to ensure that fire hazards in the workplace is evaluated, safety procedures is implemented and that the proper fire prevention information is transmitted to all affected workers.

Fire safety becomes everyone's job at worksite. Each employee should be trained about fire hazards in the workplace and about what to do in a fire emergency. Employee should be trained on how to escape during evacuation. Also, the employee should be trained to use firefighting equipment in a safe way.
